

OPPORTUNITIES ABOUND ACROSS THE WORLD

n 1872, China sent out 30 government-sponsored students to the United States to get an international education. Over the years, the number of Chinese students wanting to study overseas has grown steadily, with the United States emerging the preferred destination until recently.

As of 2021, according to data provider Statista, the United Kingdom has eclipsed the United States as the top choice among Chinese students. Home to Cambridge and Oxford, British universities possess an enviable reputation around the world.

Because of their shared history, countries in the Commonwealth inherited an excellent educational system. Their common past has also contributed to the demographic and cultural diversification of their populations, which is one of the biggest draws for young students.

Aware of their economic importance, Canadian universities, as well as the government, continue to promote the country's universities among international students, particularly those in China. This is in line with the government's goal to welcome more than 1.2 million new residents by 2023.

Apart from the United Kingdom and Canada, the Commonwealth countries of Australia and New Zealand have also become viable options for Chinese students because of their proximity, milder climate, and relaxed lifestyle, among others.

While the COVID-19 pandemic still poses challenges for countless people around the world, aspiring international students appear undeterred. In fact, Visa Tracker has reported that the number of visa applications among Chinese students grew as of August 2021.

"It has been a very challenging the past two years, but we believe the need to receive an international education is still in play, even amid a global crisis. The pandemic encouraged us to rethink some operational models to continuously fulfill our mission to bring a genuine international education to our overseas students. Therefore, we got a chance to explore an innovative partnership model to bring overseas the education we offer in Canada with our partners around the globe, including China," said Carol Lau, marketing director of TAIE International



Institute.

Because international students constitute 95% of the student body and almost 40% of those are from China, TAIE International Institute had to find ways to export Canadian education to Chinese students who could not go back to Canada.

"There are different options if they want to experience Canadian education while still in China. Our unique model provides a high flexibility for students because if they wish to come back to Canada, they can still come back and finish where they left off in China. Or, if they wish to finish the rest of the program in China, they can still get the same quality of education and qualifications after that and pursue higher education here once ready." Lau explained.

"We have developed a strong relationship with higher education institutions in North America. So far, we have around 15 partnerships with Canadian universities and colleges, so we are able to provide stable, reliable and diverse pathways for our graduates," she added.

Because of its proximity, Australia has grown increasingly popular among Chinese students who want an international education. Despite the strict COVID-related lockdown measures imposed by Australia, interest has remained very strong. One of the many reasons is how the Australian government supported all Chinese international students during the pandemic.

"During the pandemic, we had students who were in China and could not return to our campus. So, we set up Overseas Learning Centers to allow our students to take their courses but in the campus of one of our Chinese university partners," said Western Australia Business School Dean Peter Robertson.

In these challenging times, other Australian universities established similar arrangements to accommodate its Chinese students.

"Our students can obtain their degrees from certain campuses in China. We also have articulation partnerships, wherein students can do two years in China and two years in Australia

and after which they get joint degrees in the end," at the end of that period," said University of Canberra Director of Global Student Recruitment Mike Ferguson.

Meanwhile, the Australian government and its universities are working to find a way to welcome back international students without compromising the health and safety of its residents. Last December, as part of a pilot scheme, Sydney allowed entry to 250 international students to revive the education sector.

Plans to fly in a second group of students from Asia to Sydney are in the pipeline. However, the rest of Australia remains closed to foreign travelers.

"It is important that we keep our lines of communication open, that we continue to travel to each other's countries, and that students from China can come to Australia safely," stressed Aranmore Catholic College Principal Declan Tanham.

UNITED KINGDOM:

Excellence in all four corners

Having called itself "China's best partner in the West," the United Kingdom has been consistent in showing its strong commitment to supporting Chinese students in the country. In 2021 alone, British universities enrolled more than 200,000 students from China despite the restrictions on travel and delays in the processing of visas.

Presently, China accounts for the largest number of international students in the country. While many Chinese families recognize the excellence of British universities, a growing number also realize the value to sending their children to preparatory and boarding schools in the United Kingdom.

Many Chinese parents of students from Grades 4 to 12 send their children to preparatory and boarding schools to help them adjust more easily to university life. Asked for advice on how to find the perfect fit UK International Education Champion Sir Steve Smith tells parents to look beyond the capital London.

"We have four constituent nations: Scotland, Northern Ireland, Wales, and England. One big point is for students to do their research. The UK has great universities but we have other institutions with their own indisputable strengths," Smith said.

"Whether you're talking about the big research-intensive universities, like those in the Russell Group, or the smaller specialist institutions, you'll find them in any of the four nations of the UK. Parents should realize that the United Kingdom is a big country with different opportunities and provisions. I would encourage people to look at the quality elsewhere outside London," he added.

UK International Education:

A progress report



On his second year as the United Kingdom's International Education Champion, **Sir Steve Smith** met again with GMI Post to provide updates on the government's efforts to strengthen the education sector and reveal plans for the future.

GMI Post: What can Chinese students expect from the UK this coming year and where do you see growth opportunities for them in terms of work and post-secondary education?

Smith: The first thing they can expect is a safe and welcoming environment. They will get not only a great education whichever part of the UK they go to, but they will be looked after very well. They will be secure, safe, welcomed warmly. One of the big things that the British government did was introducing a post-study work visa that allows students to work here for between two and three years after graduating from PhD studies.

In the Caribbean, Tampere University of Applied Sciences came up with a program tailored for the region.

GMI Post: With travel borders reopening, what are you most excited about this upcoming year?

Smith: The most exciting thing is that people can travel again. The UK has done brilliantly in terms of distance learning and putting things online. But university is not just about learning on a screen, but also sitting in a coffee room at two in the morning discussing politics. It's going to the theater, walking down the street, shopping, traveling, talking, going to gigs, and watching theater. I think distance learning is fantastic and it's certainly important if people haven't got the resources to travel, but there's something about being there that matters.

GMI Post: What will be your priorities for the next two to three years?

Smith: I want to get to the countries that we're working with to make sure that the British government and I understand their needs. We need to ask what their needs are and talk to them about what kind of educational experience they want and what programs they want. The British government asked me to focus on key relationships and remove all barriers.

Finally, I want to set up relationships between UK institutions and institutions in those countries, because the best research in the world is now increasingly done by people based in more than one academic setting. It's about the internationalization of education and research.
